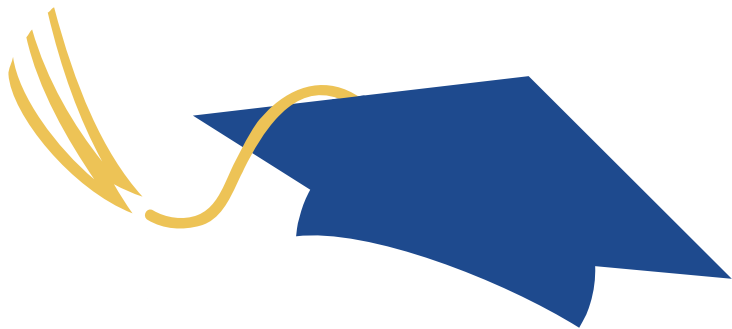

THE FUND FOR WISCONSIN SCHOLARS (FFWS) IS A PRIVATE, NOT FOR PROFIT CHARITABLE FOUNDATION.

The program was endowed in 2007 by a gift of \$175 million from John and Tashia Morgridge. The Foundation is built on the belief that every person has equal value and is worthy of the opportunity to enrich one's life and well-being through education. The overarching goal of the Foundation is to provide grants to students from low-income households who graduated from Wisconsin public high schools so that they are able to stay in school and earn a baccalaureate degree, enhancing the quality of life for Wisconsin residents by helping to ensure a highly educated workforce. FFWS is endowed so that the Foundation will continue into perpetuity.

In the 2023-24 academic year, we proudly celebrated our 3,600th Wisconsin graduate!

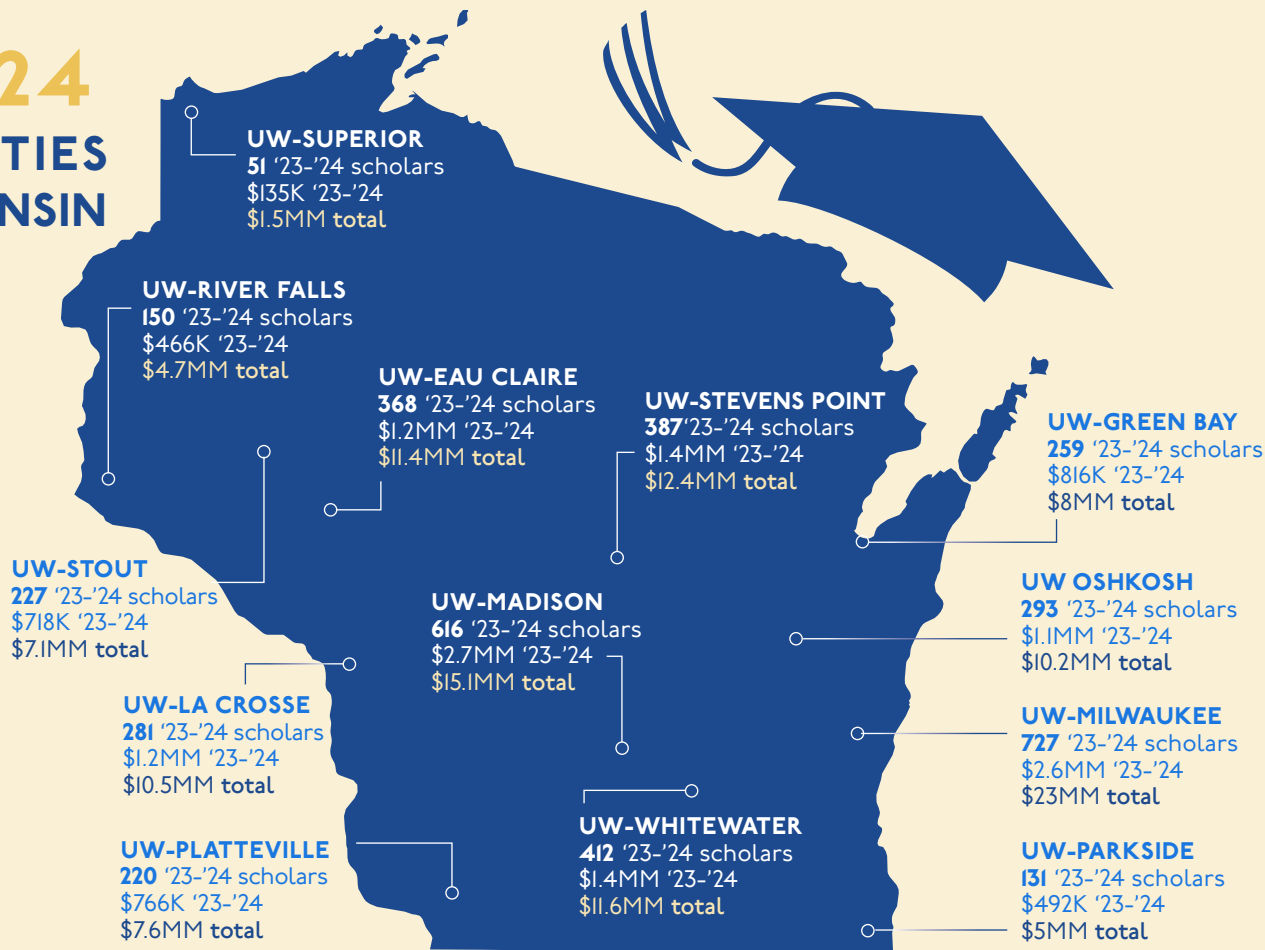
Thanks to the generosity of John and Tashia Morgridge, as well as our dedicated Board Trustees, this year marked our largest cohort yet, with 1,400 new scholars and 1,600 returning scholars. The 2023-24 cohort is already making an impact, demonstrating significant increases in engagement through the FFWS Peer Mentor Program.

Since our inception, FFWS and our campus partners have supported over 27,000 Wisconsin scholars through grants and stipends, investing more than \$140 million in Wisconsin's future workforce. Our endowment remains strong, ensuring continued access and opportunity for the next generation of scholars.

UNIVERSITIES OF WISCONSIN CAMPUS AWARDS

In 2023-24, FFWS distributed \$15 million in grants (noted as '23-'24) to over 4,000 scholars across all 13 Universities of Wisconsin campuses. Since inception (noted as 'total') FFWS has distributed \$133 million in UW system grants and \$8 million in WI technical college grants.



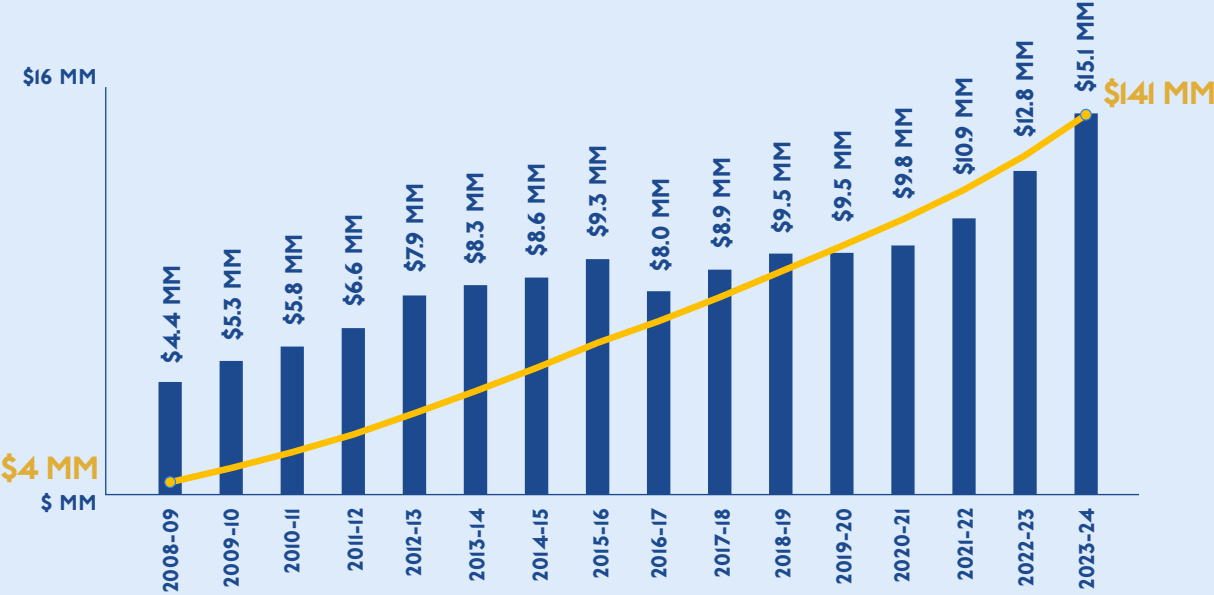
GRANTS & STIPENDS

Since 2008, FFWS has provided grant and stipend awards to selected students through the Universities of Wisconsin and Wisconsin Technical College System (WTCS). FFWS provides ongoing grants to eligible, continuing recipients as well as stipend money for distribution to additional qualified students with the long-term intent of increasing the number of students graduating from college.

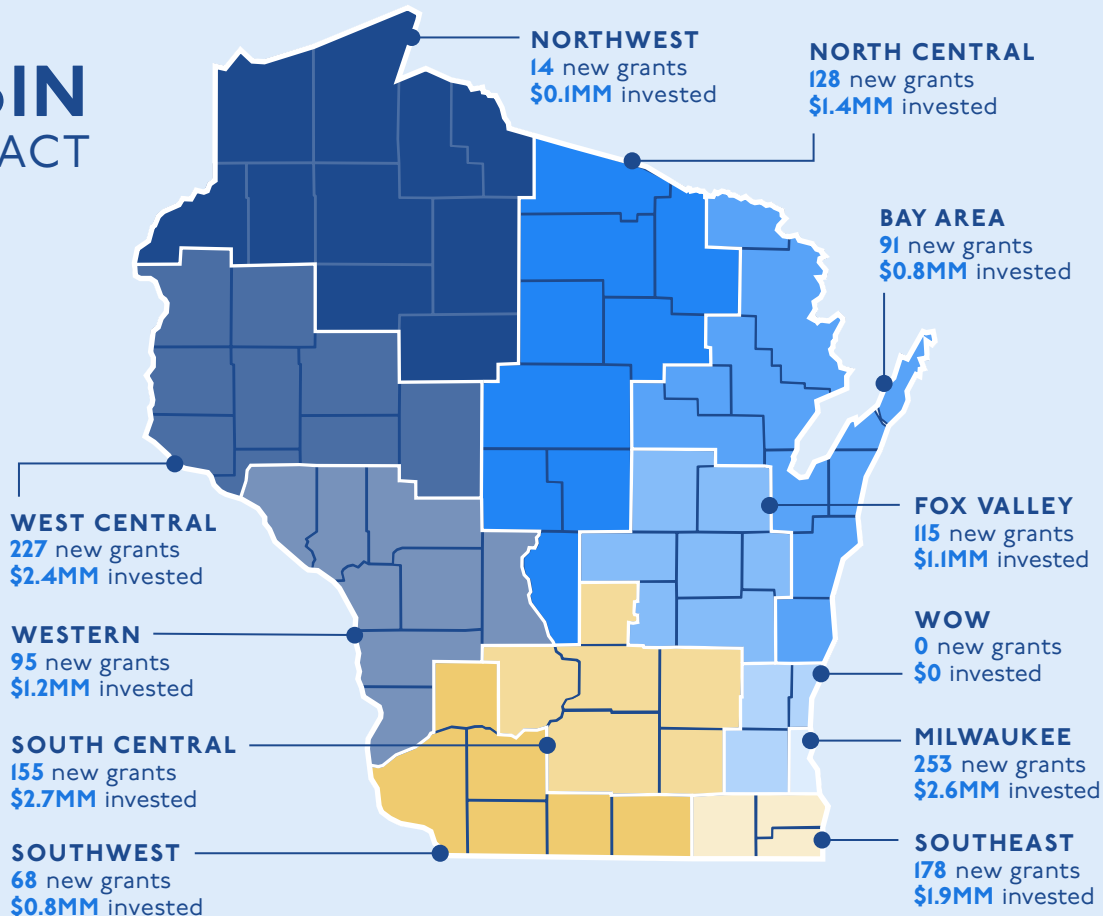

2023-24 WISCONSIN ECONOMIC IMPACT

Since the inception of FFWS in 2008-09, 14,111 students accepted the FFWS five-year grant. Another 14,086 students received a one-time stipend to provide assistance in a moment of need. All grants are needs-based and are provided to qualifying low-income students.

PEER MENTOR TRAINING AT UW-MADISON

The 2023-24 academic year marked a significant bounce back for scholar engagement across the state. The FFWS Peer Mentor Program saw a 57% increase in scholar engagement and a 98% increase in event attendance statewide.

The campus-based Peer Mentor Supervisors and their upper-class FFWS Mentors are critical to this engagement and retention effort. UW-Madison's Peer Mentor Supervisor, Emily Faultersack, exemplifies this through her outstanding dedication. Emily provides Peer Mentor leadership and team building training each year to FFWS UW-Madison Mentors.

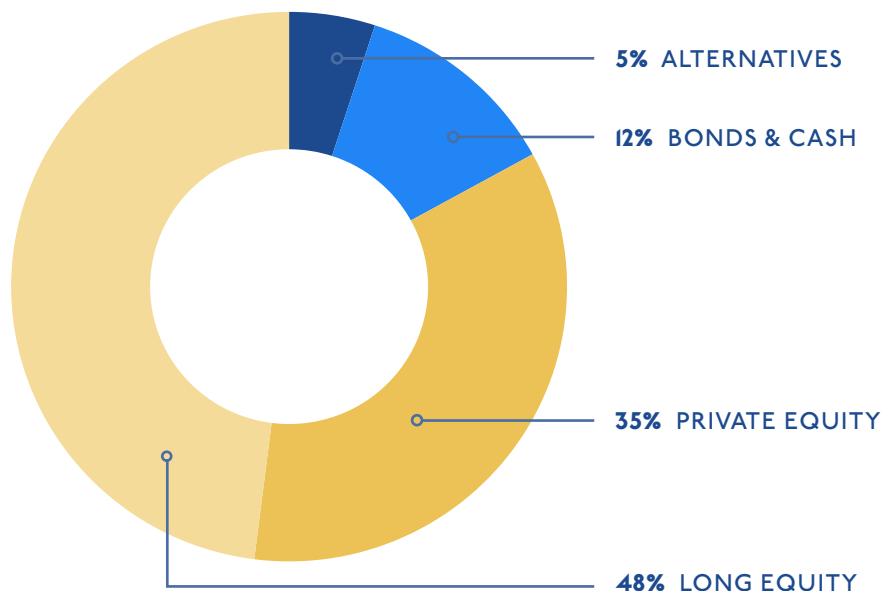
ENDOWMENT

THE CURRENT FFWS ENDOWMENT IS VALUED AT \$300 MILLION

FFWS was endowed by a generous gift of Cisco Systems, Inc. common stock from John and Tashia Morgridge in 2007. The endowment is invested according to the Board of Trustees' Investment Policy Statement (IPS), which includes requirements for asset allocation and diversification in the portfolio.

As of June 30, 2024, **FFWS has distributed over \$140 million in grants and stipends to over 27,000 Wisconsin students**, and the market value of the investment portfolio was approximately \$300 million. For the fiscal year end 2023-24, the portfolio returned 8.1% net of management fees, while the portfolio's total benchmark return over the same period was 8.9%.

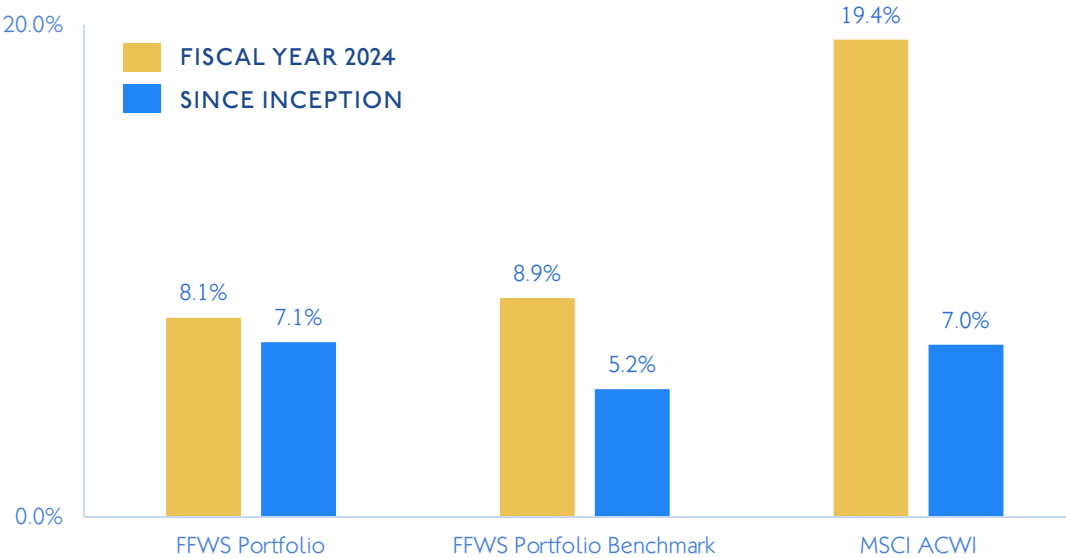
FFWS APPROVED LONG-TERM ASSET ALLOCATION TARGETS - AS OF JUNE 30, 2024



From inception in March 2008 to June 30, 2024, the portfolio has compounded at an annual rate of return of 7.1% net of management fees, with overall less volatility than the underlying global equity markets over the same period (10.0% vs. 16.7%). This compares to returns of +5.2% for the portfolio benchmark, and +7.0% for the Morgan Stanley index of the global equity markets over the same time period.

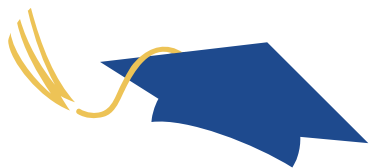
FFWS VS. PORTFOLIO BENCHMARK & GLOBAL EQUITY MARKETS*
